## Center for LNG Statement on the Energy Permitting Reform Act of 2024

(Washington, D.C.) – The Center for LNG (CLNG) issued the following statement in reaction to Senators Manchin and Barrasso introducing the *Energy Permitting Reform Act of 2024*.

## Charlie Riedl, CLNG Executive Director, said:

"The Energy Permitting Reform Act of 2024 includes important provisions to provide regulatory certainty for large-scale U.S. LNG export facilities, ensures fact-based decisionmaking on future studies by the Department of Energy (DOE) around the economic and climate benefits of continued U.S. LNG exports, and incentivizes investments in U.S. infrastructure that are vital to our national interests and global climate goals.

"This legislation would permanently end the Department of Energy's devastating pause on U.S. LNG export authorizations and unlock more of the benefits of U.S. LNG exports at home and around the globe.
